The Faculty of Philosophy and Arts of Trnava University in Trnava has the following facilities in the faculty's main building in Hornopotočná Street: 1 hall with 126 seats, 1 hall with 96 seats, 5 lecture rooms with a capacity of 52 to 90 seats, 12 seminar rooms with a capacity of 20 to 40 seats. The lecture and seminar rooms are equipped with presentation technology (data projector, screen, laptop, visualizer, LCD TV, interactive whiteboard). Besides two classrooms, the department uses two rooms. One of them serves as a study for the department's staff, the other as the department's library. The department also has two specialized rooms, which are used for research purposes, practical exercises and work with archaeological material. The department also has a specialized temporary storeroom for archaeological finds from its excavations. In addition, a comparative collection of copies of archaeological artefacts is used in the teaching process. Every classroom where classical archaeology is taught has an integrated data projector and a screen. The department also has other computer and technical equipment: 2 desktop computers, 3 laptops, 3 printers (OKI C5510 MFP, HP LaserJet 1300, Canon BJC-250), 1 scanner (HP Scanlet 5530), external HDD Teac 200, and a data projector. Technical equipment used for archaeological excavations and during the practical courses: Leica Geodetic Station, Garmin GPS, metal detector, Nikon D400 and D5000 cameras with accessories. A small photo studio with lighting lamps is also used to document the finds.

The University Library of Trnava University is the central library of Trnava University. It provides professional library and information services, stores qualifications theses and creates bibliographic records, creates bibliographic records for the publications of teachers, researchers and doctoral students of TU, provides library and information services to students, teachers and employees of TU and to the professional public. It organizes professional events and provides information education. It develops relations with domestic and foreign partners, especially through the exchange of documents. The relations between the library and its users are regulated by the Library and Borrowing Rules of the University Library of Trnava University. The mission, basic tasks and organizational structure are defined by the Organizational Rules of Trnava University Library. The profile of the library corresponds to the study fields offered at Trnava University, with a focus on publications in the fields of humanities, social sciences and natural sciences. Print library units are complemented by electronic information sources, accessible on the basis of IP addresses of Trnava University. The Faculty of Philosophy and Arts of Trnava University publishes study literature (textbooks) for students in printed and especially in electronic form. Educational materials are stored in the electronic library, which is freely accessible through the faculty's website: http://ff.truni.sk/publikacie-novinky. In addition, the Department of Classical Archaeology has its own department library, which students use for studying, exam preparation, and writing papers. The department pays special attention to the expansion of the book collection through purchase, and in particular through international exchange of books (it has its own publications, especially the conference proceedings Anodos). The exchange takes place continuously with dozens of domestic and foreign partners. The publications in the department's book collection are registered i

The department has a long-term cooperation with the Institute of Archaeology of the Slovak Academy of Sciences in Nitra; the institutions have cooperated on several scientific projects (currently Vega projects). PhD students in particular benefit from these projects, because the themes of some of their final theses are defined in the projects. Thanks to this long-term and fruitful cooperation, a number of doctoral theses have been successfully defended, using excavation artefacts provided by the Institute of Archaeology. The most important sites are Iža (a national cultural monument, and a UNESCO site since 2021). Cífer-Pác and Milanoyce. We regard this cooperation as an important example of a Institution partners in providing educational activities for the study programme and the characteristics of their mutually beneficial cooperation between a university and a research institution. In addition, the department cooperates with several museums participation. in Slovakia. PhD students of the Department of Classical Archaeology have participated in the documentation and evaluation of the finds deposited in the depositories of these institutions (e.g. Bratislava-Rusovce/Gerulata, West-Slovak Museum). In 2016, the department signed an agreement on cooperation in the field of underwater archaeology with the Slovenian ZAPA Institute (Zavod za podvodno arheologijo) and the Institute of Archaeology of the Slovak Academy of Sciences. The cooperation is focused on the methodology of underwater archaeological surveys and its adaptation to river conditions. Students have the opportunity to participate in excavations organized by this institute. Another partner institution is the Pro Archaeologia Classica Civic Association, which participates in the organization and financing of the Forum Tyrnaviense lecture series (e.g. http://ff.truni.sk/oznamy/forum-tyrnaviense-prednasky-pre-verejnost-aj-studentov).

The university provides conditions for regular sports activities for its students. Sports activities: football, volleyball, basketball, futsal, floorball and swimming. Since 2004, the university has organized Sports Days, where students compete against employees. There are traditional competitions in basketball, volleyball and futsal for the rector's challenge cup, and table tennis tournaments for a university champion. The best contestants represent the university at university games in Slovakia or at occasional competitions between Slovak universities.
