Students will be able to prepare and present papers, co-presentations or discussion papers at scientific events and to work effectively as a member of a research team. PhD study programme is all-embracing preparation for academic and scientific profession. Graduates of the programme will also be able to draw up expert opinions and expert reports. The defense of the dissertation is a state exam and is the final form of control of the results of the doctoral study and the scientific level of the submitted thesis. Emphasis is laid on the student's scientific contribution and their ability to solve problems in broader, including international, contexts. The thesis is a verification of a methodological procedure and the chosen solution method. The defense is public and takes place in the form of opposition and defense of the dissertation before a commission appointed by the chairman of the trade union committee. The course of the defense is as follows: 1. The student presents the dissertation. 2. The supervisor's and the opponent's assessments are read. 3. The student takes a position on the assessments. 4. The student responds to the comments of the supervisor, opponents and members of the state commission. 5. The dissertation thesis is assessed by the state commission.</p>

<p>List and characteristics of the study programme classrooms and their technical equipment with the assignment to learning outcomes and courses (laboratories, design and art studios, studios, workshops, interpreting booths, clinics, priest seminaries, science and technology parks, technology incubators, school enterprises, practice centers, training schools, classroom-training facilities, sports halls, swimming pools, sports grounds).</p>	<p>The Faculty of Philosophy and Arts of Trnava University in Trnava has the following facilities in the faculty's main building in Hornopotočná Street:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 hall with 126 seats, 1 hall with 96 seats, 5 lecture rooms with a capacity of 52 to 90 seats, 12 seminar rooms with a capacity of 20 to 40 seats. <p>The lecture and seminar rooms are equipped with presentation technology (data projector, screen, laptop, visualizer, LCD TV, interactive whiteboard). Besides two classrooms, the department uses two rooms. One of them serves as a study for the department's staff, the other as the department's library. Every classroom where Slovak history is taught has an integrated data projector and a screen. The department also has other computer and technical equipment: 3 desktop computers, 3 laptops, 3 digital printers, 1 scanner, external HDD and a data projector. The reference library of the Department of History contains more than 4000 volumes of publications. Its collection is continuously supplemented with domestic and foreign literature acquired in exchange for own publication production with partner departments abroad and cooperation with scientific institutions. It also contains the main professional periodicals. Its special section includes the outputs of the teachers working at the Department. The department's seminar library also includes archived bachelor's, diploma, rigorosum and dissertation theses, which are available to those interested in studying them in the form of full-time study. The Seminary Library has its own regime, is managed by one of the internal staff of the Department and is available for students for borrowing and studying by attendance, for which there are fixed opening hours. The library has a catalogue of books arranged by author, a catalogue of books arranged by title and a catalogue of periodicals and journals, which are accessible to students in electronic form on the department's website.</p>
<p>Characteristics of the study programme information management (access to study literature according to Course information sheets, access to information databases and other information sources, information technologies, etc.).</p>	<p>The University Library of Trnava University is the central library of Trnava University. It provides professional library and information services, stores qualifications theses and creates bibliographic records, creates bibliographic records for the publications of teachers, researchers and doctoral students of TU, provides library and information services to students, teachers and employees of TU and to the professional public. It organizes professional events and provides information education. It develops relations with domestic and foreign partners, especially through the exchange of documents. The relations between the library and its users are regulated by the Library and Borrowing Rules of the University Library of Trnava University. The mission, basic tasks and organizational structure are defined by the Organizational Rules of Trnava University Library. The profile of the library corresponds to the study fields offered at Trnava University, with a focus on publications in the fields of humanities, social sciences and natural sciences. Print library units are complemented by electronic information sources, accessible on the basis of IP addresses of Trnava University. The Faculty of Philosophy and Arts of Trnava University publishes study literature (textbooks) for students in printed and especially in electronic form. Educational materials are stored in the electronic library, which is freely accessible through the faculty's website: http://ff.truni.sk/publikacie-novinky. Many materials are also published in MOODLE courses. This makes it much easier for students to access them. In addition, all faculty departments also have their own reference libraries, which also provide students with literature, mainly used in the preparation of qualifying theses. The Department of History has an extensive reference library that serves the needs of both department members and students. The University has a good hardware and software infrastructure allowing the expansion of access points to the Internet and to the University's information systems. There are up to 100 terminals in the corridors of the university buildings, in the computer rooms and in the study room of the University Library, which are used exclusively by the students of the university for self-study and free access to the Internet. In addition to the terminals, over 1000 personal computers (including laptops) are connected to the university data network, of which over 700 are used in the teaching process.
